Mission of the conference

- Exchange experiences in teaching peace-relevant knowledge, skills and values to health professionals and students.
- Strengthen the network of scholars and health professionals committed to violence prevention, sustainable peace-building, and human rights protection.
- Assist the advancement of peace education and practice in the health sector.
- Contribute to the review of the Medical Peace Work online course and facilitate its dissemination and incorporation into medical and health education.
- Develop an action plan for institutionalizing peace work as an integral part of medical and public health practice.



Background

Violence and war cause enormous human suffering and impose a huge burden on the health sector. Health workers therefore have a professional responsibility not only for treating injuries and diseases, but also for contributing to violence prevention, sustainable peacebuilding and human rights promotion.

Over the past 15 years it has increasingly been acknowledged that there is a need for training health professionals in peace-related skills, knowledge and values.

Several universities, organisations and vocational training institutions have launched distinct courses in “Peace-through-Health”, “Violence Prevention”, “Global Health”, or “Health and Human Rights”. Many challenges remain, however, in the effort to create awareness of and strengthen the peace capacities of health professionals.

This conference will be another step towards peace mainstreaming in medical training and research.

MPW partners will present outcomes of the workshop at the symposium.
